For best outcomes, take a breastfeeding class, check out online resources, see if you qualify for WIC, find a lactation consultant, and find out how to get a pump if you need one – *all while you're still pregnant*. Additional resources are available - work with your IBCLC or WIC office to identify the appropriate resources for your needs.

Contact your health care provider or an IBCLC (lactation consultant) if you have any concerns or if... • You did not feel your milk come in by day 3 or 4. • Your baby is very sleepy and does not wake to feed. • You have breast and/or nipple pain. • Your breasts are uncomfortably full and do not feel softer after feedings. • Your baby has a fever or is too sleepy to feed. • You feel like you have the flu or if you are running a fever. • You are considering using formula because of problems with breastfeeding.

Health Care Providers (MDs, NDs, etc. - may require a referral)

We recommend working with an IBCLC as the first step in assessing feeding difficulties and coordinating wrap-around care for challenges that may require referral to a health care provider, such as tongue and lip tie.
